**Reading G.K. Chesterton's *What's Wrong With the World*  
A Proper Understanding of Man, Woman, the Family, and Education as a  
Foundation for a Global Culture**

*One UNIV, One Book*

1. In many college campuses right now, educators are promoting the idea, "One Campus, One Book." Given all the different courses, ideas, and interests of students, it is often difficult to enable a common discussion among all students. So, we suggest encouraging all students to read the same book as a basis for a common discussion. That is, "One UNIV, One Book."

2. In this activity, participants will read G.K. Chesterton's *What's Wrong With the World*. The leader of the seminar will give a short introduction to the book, inciting the audience to pose their own questions in developing a common discussion about the human person, the political community, and education as they relate to globalization.
